I'm curious to know what resources you would reference or what guidelines you would offer for getting people interested and involved with home or community gardening - how does one turn people who have no prior experience with gardening into self-motivated produce-growers? I'm interested in the burgeoning effort to use community and home gardens as a solution to food deserts, obesity, and poor nutrition (among many other problems), especially in urban areas; however, I'm concerned that this effort overlooks the challenges in getting low-income, low-education city-dwellers to pick up a totally new skill of food production - especially one that requires a great deal of patience, commitment, care, regularity, and time.
